Chanteshea Theresa Bulluck was born on December 16, 1977, at Greater Southeast Hospital in Washington, D.C., to the late Eric C. Bulluck and Angelena T. Farrar-Moore. She was affectionately known as “Chante” or “Shawn” to all her friends and family.

Chante was raised in Washington, D.C., and lived in the Washington metropolitan area all of her life. She attended D.C. Public Schools and graduated from H. D. Woodson High School, Class of 1995. In continuing her education, Chante received numerous certifications in the field of information technology, and was known for her love and skills with anything pertaining to mathematics and numbers. She additionally earned an Associate Degree in Business Management from Ohio Christian University in 2017. Throughout her career, she served in both private industry and government roles, culminating in her 25 years of service at The National Institutes of Health.

As a child, while being raised by her father and stepmother Beverly Bulluck, Chante joined From the Heart Church Ministries in 1981. This is where she formalized her bond with God.

Chante had a deep love of family instilled in her from a very young age. She was an avid planner and always looked forward to hosting family gatherings on holidays, especially Christmas. She would plan her holiday menu to the “T” and expected you to ONLY bring what she requested. 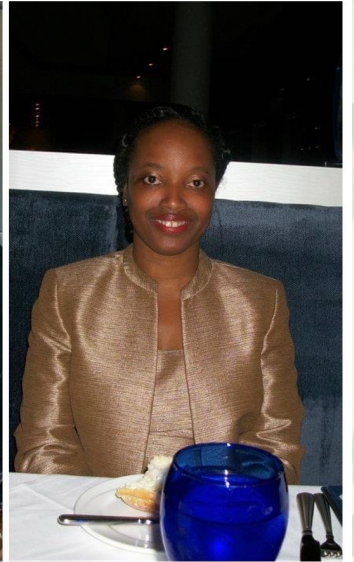
*In the Garden of time, a flower did bloom
