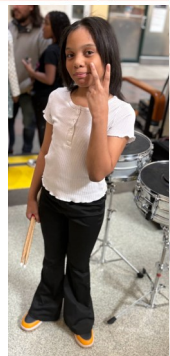
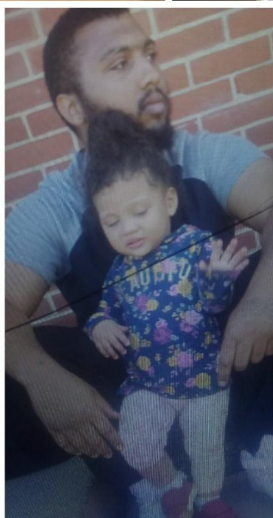
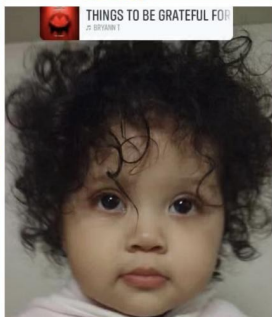
*What do you say about a silent GIANT?
